E.D. Ewing Award



Buildings in the City of Brighton are eligible for nomination if recent construction, remodeling or redesign have occurred consistent with and improving upon the City's standard of appearance, comfort and community betterment.

The E.D. Ewing Award honors single and multiple-family dwellings in the City of Brighton, which through recent design, renovation, improvements or construction of a building or home beautifies and betters the City.

Noeker Award
